Therapeutic Recreation

The Gloucester County Department of Educational and Disability Services provides a Summer Day Program for school aged children, ages 5 to 16 years, diagnosed with Asperger Syndrome, ADHD, PDD, OCD and other social/behavioral problems.

This extended school year program is located on the North Campus of Bankbridge Regional School. The camp is in session for five weeks – Monday to Thursday - July 6th through August 6th.

The camp is designed to create a sense of competency and accomplishment while developing appropriate peer relationships. The camp provides a play-based structured program of recreational opportunities and social skill teaching to students who have socially inappropriate behaviors, sensory, communication, and motor and sequencing difficulties.

Red Bank Battlefield Park

100 Hessian Avenue, National Park, (856) 853-5120

Open year-round from dawn to dusk, historic Red Bank Battlefield provides accessibility to the waterfront, open park space, groves of trees, playgrounds and picnic pavilions. The Whitall House (1748) is located in the park and is open Wednesday- Friday, 9 am to 4 pm; Saturday and Sunday, 1 to 4 pm, tours by appointment. The remains of Fort Mercer, a successful Revolutionary War Battle site, are located in the northern section of the park. Various monuments denoting historical events and illustrated signage offers visitors a self-guided tour.

Scotland Run Park/Wilson Lake

980 Academy Street, Clayton, (856) 881-0845

The park is open year-round from dawn to dusk.

Scotland Run Park is the largest of the county parks (1000 acres). Wilson Lake offers passive recreation opportunities including a handicap accessible fishing pier, boating and nature observation. The playground and picnic areas are across the street from the nature center. The nature center offers a variety of environmental education programs for all ages. Walking trails are located behind the nature center and on the lake-side of the park.

Greenwich Lake Park

Tomlin Station Road, Gibbstown

Open April to November 30th, sunrise to sunset.

Greenwich Lake Park offers a variety of aquatic-related activities. A popular fishing spot, Greenwich Lake is stocked with trout several times a season by the NJ Department of Fish and Game. The 40-acre spring-fed Greenwich Lake is accessible for boating too. The boat launch is open on weekends only from the start of trout season to Memorial Day. Support facilities at Greenwich Lake Park include picnic tables and grills. Bathroom facilities are available April through October.

Atkinson Memorial Park is a 66-acre recreation area with varied facilities to meet the needs of all age groups including two playgrounds, picnic pavilion, amphitheater, lighted tennis courts, basketball courts softball/soccer/football fields a baseball field, over a mile of jogging/bicycling trails, exercise course and Millennium Plaza.

DREAM Park

Facilities feature a temperature controlled indoor arena with bleacher seating for 600 spectators, a separate area for auctions, exhibits, or off season instructional clinics, restrooms and a concession area. The facility has two barns to accommodate 238 horses, 5 outdoor rings, one with lighting for night events, and designated parking for trailers and RV's. The DREAM Park has 44 resident stables with 3 private warm up and exercise rings.
